You could also practise this at home by playing 'Fred Says'.



Talk for Writing

We teach Talk for Writing daily. This is a fantastic way of supporting children in developing their language and storytelling skills. We begin by introducing the story verbally with actions at key points. Once the children are confident in telling the story verbally we then work together to draw our story map (Pictured above). We put the story map in our book corner so the children can retell the story to one another. We eventually move on to innovating the story to change key parts. This develops the children's imagination and confidence in creating their own stories. Whenever we complete a story map we will share it with you so you can read the story at home, see if your child can have a go at retelling the story of Baa Baa Black Sheep to you. It doesn't matter if they miss parts out, what matters is they are able to tell you a story that they have enjoyed in their own way.
