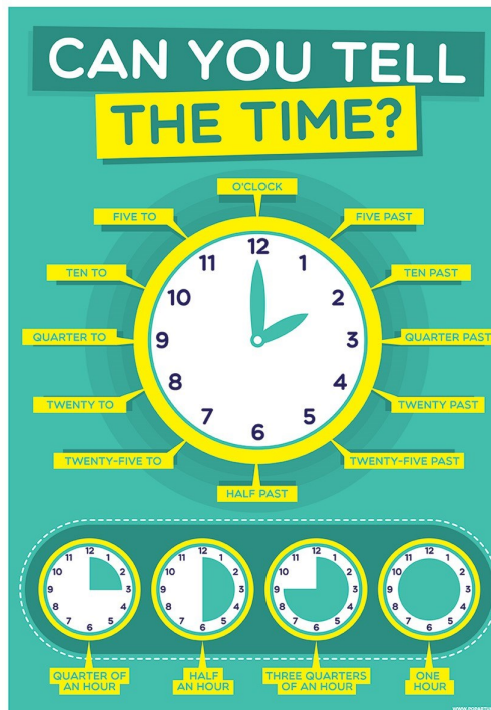
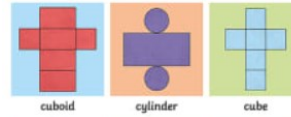
### How to support your child at home:
