Science week

This week has been Science week. All of the children have spent their afternoons investigating and learning about different things in their science topics. It was great fun and great learning.

LATERAL FLOW TESTING

All adults in school are taking part in the voluntary twice-weekly lateral flow device testing - primary pupils are not tested in school.

Families are now able to access lateral flow testing at home - you can collect kits from certain centres or order them to be delivered. These test are done at home, you don't send them off, you just need to report the result and follow the guidance if the test shows a positive result. Information is on the Government website -

If you're a member of a household, childcare bubble of a pupil, student or staff of a school, nursery or college, you can get a twice-weekly test:

- through your employer if they offer testing to employees
- at a local test site
- by collecting a home test kit from a test site
- by ordering a home test kit online

Please keep following the rules and guidance - we are still in lockdown! If anyone in the household has symptoms children should not attend school until that person has had a negative test result. If the test is positive, all of the household MUST isolate for 10 days.

Know your Games and Online Safety Resources

The following are some of the most popular Games & Apps currently being used by children. We have daily issues in school that follow on from issues from social media and gaming sites/apps. It is your responsibility, as parents, to supervise and monitor your child's online activity. Most of the apps and games we hear are not age appropriate and children have put false information in to register or they tell us that parents have registered for them!

PLEASE MAKE SURE YOU KNOW WHAT YOUR CHILD IS DOING ONLINE, WHO THEY ARE TALKING TO AND WHAT THEY ARE SAYING.



1 - Twitch is a live streaming site which lets gamers share live gameplay for others to watch and comment on.



2 - **Roblox** is an online game and app which allows creation of own games, play games others have made or chat to other players. There are parental controls that allow for a selection of chat options and a PIN to

allow age appropriate games to be played.



3 - **Among Us** is popular with primary school children. Players can join a game with their friends and the game randomly selects one of the players to be an 'imposter' who the other players aim to defeat.

Know your Apps



4 - TikTok is a global video community where users create, share and discover short video clips.
By default user accounts are automatically set to public when an account is created. This means
anyone in the world can see what a user has posted on their account and can make contact with them.



5 - Snapchat is a picture and video sharing app. Users can specify how long these posts stay on for before they

disappear. However this does not mean images are permanently deleted as screen shots can be taken.

'Geofilters' can also be used which can show where a person is.
