Please remember you all have access to the Oxford Owl website if you would like more books to read at home.

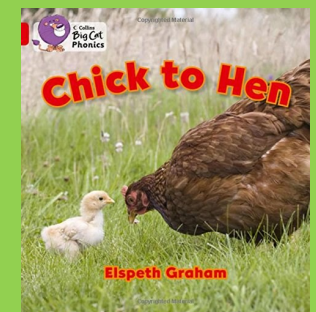
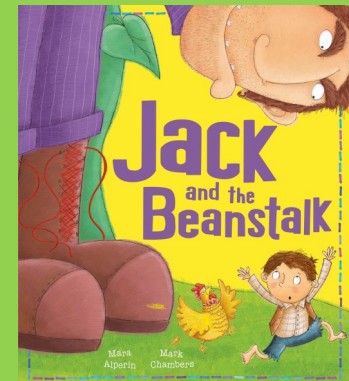
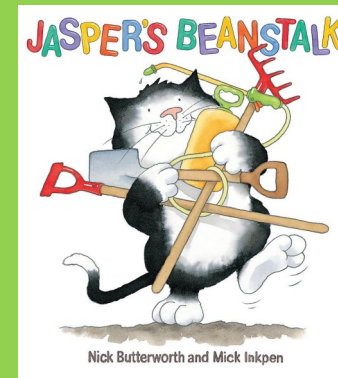

- To take into account what my friends say.
