### Y5 Parliamentary Workshop



Year 5 have been learning about the role of parliament as part of their PSHE curriculum. They have learnt what a member of Parliament does, how laws are made and why democracy is so important. The Parliament Education Team spoke to the children via video call and taught them about the House of Commons and House of Lords, and how both play a vital part in creating new laws. Mrs Hathaway said, "It was fascinating to carry out role play and take part in a debate on the introduction of a new law."

Additionally, children were joined by Tamworth MP, Christopher Pincher and made the most of the opportunity to ask them lots of questions, such as,, 'What made you get into politics?', 'Have you ever visited the Victoria and Elizabeth Towers?' There was even a cheeky request from Reece - 'Would you like to come and visit us at Bird's Bush?' Mr Pincher responded that he would love to!

Schools have a duty to 'actively promote' the fundamental British values of democracy, the rule of law, individual liberty, and mutual respect and tolerance of those with different faiths and beliefs. These are embedded within our curriculum and our school values and this was a great opportunity for the children to experience 'rule of law' at the highest level. We were delighted that Mr Pincher was able to join in with the discussions and look forward to him visiting Bird's Bush soon.

To celebrate this exciting week we are holding our own **STEM fair**! We are inviting children **to create their own STEM project at home which demonstrates their understanding of 'Growth'**. For example, children could look at plant growth, population growth, how animals or humans grow ... the possibilities are endless! We would be very grateful if you could support your children in their project, discussing the scientific theory behind their project.

If children wish to enter, they **need to bring their project**, along with an explanation of the science behind their work, to class on **Monday 14th March**.

Each project will be celebrated, however one winner will be chosen from each class and will receive a certificate. These winners will be entered into our STEM fair where our panel of judges will be invited to select a winner from each Key Stage on **Wednesday 16th March**. The Science fair will be in the hall from 3.15 - 3.45pm on Wednesday, come and have a look!

In addition to our STEM projects, we would love for you to email in a **'Science Selfie'** of the children, to the email address, caught doing something scientific (Could they be observing the nature in their garden? Taking part in identifying changes in materials when cooking? Exploring slime? Exploring in

a museum?) Each selfie entered will be added to our school display and the best entry will receive a prize.
