## Homework:



- 2. Purple Mash—this will be set once a week. It is set on a Friday and closes on a Wednesday. By completing their weekly homework, your child will be automatically entered into the weekly homework draw.
- 3. **ttRockstars**—a times table website that will support your child's times tables. It is important to support your child to learn their times tables to help prepare them for the year 4 times table check. Please ensure that your child is plays the Soundcheck game regularly to ensure that their speed is increasing. In this game, they have 25 questions to answer with 6 seconds allocated for each question.


