Homework:


- 1. Read at least three times a week. This will help to build up your child's fluency and speed for reading. Please ensurethat you sign your child's diary. They can collect Read It tickets for every read. Reading can include their home reader, their library book (please be aware that this chosen for pleasure and is not linked to their reading ability), subtitles on a tv programme, signs or even information in a computer game.
- Purple Mash—this will be set once a week. It is set on a Friday and closes on a Wednesday. By completing their weekly homework, your child will be automatically entered into the weekly homework draw.
- 3. Numbot's—a times table website that will support your child's times tables. It is important to support your child to learn their times tables to help prepare them for the year 4 times table check. Please ensure that your child is plays the Soundcheck game regularly to ensure that their speed is increasing. In this game, they have 25 questions to answer with 6 seconds allocated for each question.


