1 - Year 4- Statutory Multiplication Tables Check.

In June this year (2022), all Year 4 children will have their multiplication skills formally assessed through a statutory assessment called the Multiplication Tables Check (MTC).

The purpose of the statutory MTC is to determine whether pupils can recall their times tables fluently, which is essential for future success in mathematics. It will help schools to identify pupils who have not yet mastered their times tables, so that additional support can be provided.

If you'd like to find out more about the MTC, Mrs Hathaway will be running a parent workshop on **Tuesday 10th May 3:15-3:45** in the Year 4 classroom.
