More information for parents will be available shortly but if you wish to find out more, Ruth Miskin's website offers useful videos to introduce you to the programme.

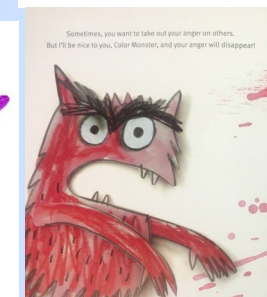
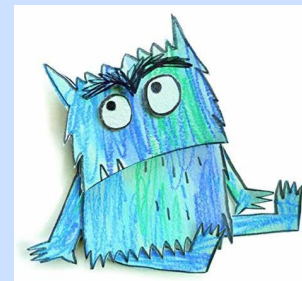

Personal, Social & Emotional development

- To select and use resources with help.
- To gain confidence in new social situations.
