Please keep an eye on the newsletter to find out what your child has been learning each week and how you can help at home.

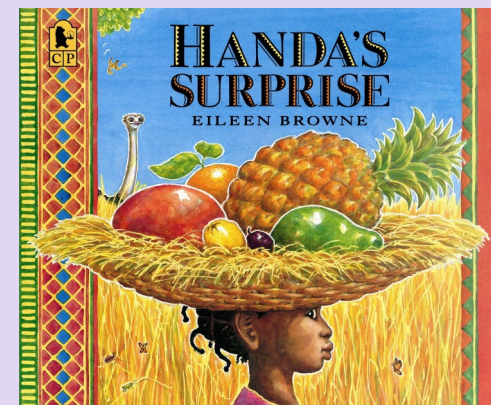
### **How to support your child at home:**

## Personal, Social & Emotional development

Children know and develop strong, warm and supportive relationships with each other and the adults in the classroom. Children are developing the skills to manage their own emotions and feelings and consider those of others. Children will learn to look after their bodies through healthy eating and have conversations about healthy choices.

## Communication and Language

-Children will know how to make comments about their own observations and describe what they can see. Through quality conversations, children will learn how to engage in 'serve and return' based conversations appropriately.

## Physical Development

-Children will know and use the three friend hold. Children will know and use animal positions (bear, penguin, meerkat, stone lion and meerkat) Children will know how to use a variety of one handed tools e.g. paintbrushes, scissors, rollers. Children will know how to safely use knives to cut fruit.

## Literacy

-Children will confidently apply their phonic skills  
- Children will know how to retell a story in the correct sequence.  
- Children will know how to segment and re-code simple words and phrases. (sentences, labelling etc)  
Children will use new vocabulary within full sentences.

## Understanding the World

-Children will know how to draw information from maps and globes to find their country and other significant countries. Children will know what is the same and what is different between life in the UK and other countries. Children will recognise some environments that are different to the one in which they live.

## Mathematics

- Children will learn how to double numbers
- Children will learn different ways to sort objects
- Children will develop their understanding of numbers to 5 and how it can be made up
- Children will develop their spatial reasoning skills

## Expressive Arts & Design

-Children will know how to listen and respond to different styles of music (from around the world) Children will know how to create their own representations using a variety of media (artist study Arcimboldo). Children will create observational drawings and create their own artwork. Children will make sculptures.
