

English

In writing, we are continuing to use Talk for Writing to develop the children as story tellers. During this last term we will be revisiting all of the skills we have learnt so far.. Ensuring children have the opportunity to practice using these skills in their writing.

The skills are capital letters, full stops, question marks, exclamation marks and adjectives to describe.

Ar

We will continue to explore style, and narrative in art exploring different art movements uch as pointillism, realism and abstract.

Geography

This term we are exploring Parliament and Prime misters. This will also enable us to take part in an election and explore democracy.

Maths

In maths, we are continuing to develop our understanding of 2d and 3d shapes. We will then revisit addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. This will include ensuring the children recognise the symbols that represent these. Then we will be exploring fractions including a half and a quarter. The final 2 weeks will be spent strengthening our mathematical skills ready for Year2.

DT

How to support your child at home:

This term Year I children will sit the Phonics Screening Assessment, hopefully you had the chance to attend one of the workshops around this as can support you child using the pack provided (all children will receive this pack).

It is also really important to hear your child read or read to your child at least three times a week. Any reading your child does earns them a ticket to be in with a chance of winning a new book in the celebration assembly each Friday.

Reading regularly and using their phonic skills to decode will also have a positive impact on their writing skills! Please ensure your child reads their RWI books that are sent home in their reading folder. These are sent home every Friday and must be returned to school the following Thursday so they can be changed.
