Reading is incredibly important and we ask that you hear your child read at least 3 times a week. Please sign their reading diary after each read and we will exchange these for Read It tickets. The children will either bring home a book banded book or a RWI book to read, both are closely matched to their reading/phonics ability. The RWI books will be changed every Thursday. Book banded books may be changed as frequently as required, although we would urge you to read these more than once to help support your child's fluency.

Library books are available within the classroom. These are chosen to be read to or with your child. The children may change these every Tuesday.
