For children who are no longer on the phonics programme, we have launched our brand-new book scheme! Big Cat! These new books aim to build fluency, comprehension and a love of reading. All children will also have a reading for pleasure book too which they will have chosen from their class library.

Bird's Bush children have loved their new Talk 4 Writing units this half-term. Our new approach to writing has enabled the children to apply their skills in a range of creative genres. Talk for Writing is an engaging teaching framework based on the principles of how children learn. It enables children to imitate the language they need for a particular topic orally, before reading and analysing it, and then writing their own version

They have made a super start to their phonics learning and are enjoying reading lots of stories, poems and nursery rhymes.

Book and biscuit sessions have been popular this half term and it has been lovely to see so many family members sharing our love of reading.

In Maths, Reception have loved using Number Blocks to help us to learn numbers to 5. They have explored using Numicon, dice, blocks, counters and so much more!



Year Two - Kingfishers have had an amazing start to the year!


In maths we have been adding and subtracting using partitioning. We are gelling very good at using numicon and dienes to help with our tricky learning. We also learnt about 2D and 3D shapes and patterns. In the holidays we will be looking for 3D shapes around our home, please help us. We are trying really hard each week in our Masters of multiplication!

In English, we have produced some super writing using our Kinetic letters. We have written our own Jack and the beanstalk stories, which we read to our Reception friends. We made Wanted posters for the scary monsters from

our defeat the monster stories and we have written letters to complain about the treatment of the stationary from the book 'The day the crayons $\operatorname{Quit}\nolimits'.$ Every day we work hard in our RWI group to keep practicing our sounds.

In our other lessons we have learnt about our bodies and all of the different systems inside us — digestive system, the circulatory system and the skeletal system. We have been learning how to look after our environment in R.E and thought about why we have a school council in our school. We have even had time to elect our school council members by voting democratically. In Geography we have been learning how to read maps of the local area and the world. We have been finding countries, learning about the Equator and the Northern and Southern Hemisphere. We even drew our own maps of school. They are very good!!

We have really enjoyed this half term and being at school. We are very excited about new learning after the holidays.



Year One - Woodpeckers have had the best start to their year!

We have been doing some fantastic learning in all of our subjects, from science to dance lessons! This has really helped us to explore our knowledge about the 5 human senses of touch, taste, smell, sight and hearing! We further explored inspirational individuals, such as Helen Keller, who was the first blind and deaf woman to go to University to achieve a degree.

In our maths lessons, we have been looking at the differences between length and height, and have been using our counting skills to measure objects accurately with rulers! We have been pushing our potential with our mathematical language and have remembered to

include 'cm's' when working out how long or tall something is.

In our writing, we learnt the story of 'The Three Little Pigs' and created our own versions, such as 'The

Three Little Ducks'. We then used this story to create our own dream houses, which often included lots of swimming pools and sweets!



Year Three - Kestrels



We have been busy this half term creating some fabulous artwork in year 3. We have been printing to create lines, like the lines in Hokusai's, The Great Wave off Kanagawa, 1829-33. We used a

pencil to pake holes into our printing tiles to make a flower. After that, we used paint to cover our flowers and printed it onto card.

As part of our PE curriculum we have been focusing on dance and team work.

In science we have been learning about the body and how it works. We have also started to use run interactive games to help us to check what we have learnt.

In English, we have been reading the story The Truth About Trolls, we have been busy rewriting the story to turn it into our own!






In maths, we have been doing lots of work around place value. We have learnt how to partition numbers and add them across a column.


Year 6 - Falcons
