

World Book Day


Children across school enjoyed reading the book The Invisible by Tom Percival. They enjoyed

Easter Celebrations



This term we have explored the topic seasons and changes. We learnt about the four seasons and the changes in weather. We also planted our very own cress seeds and watched them grow!




In Maths we have been learning about the composition of numbers up to five.


PE Fun!

Geography — The South West




I enjoyed multiplying and dividing the decimals. Henry



This Spring, we have been hard at work preparing for the SATs in the Summer Term but we have also been working hard across all of the other subjects as well.


